From	Teachers Low grades that don't reflect your child's performance Not implementing or ignoring your child's IEP (Individualized Education Program) Child is ignored in class Disciplined for small matters (often for things related to disability) Being singled out negatively Refusal to make reasonable accommodations for disabilities

From	District Not offering training and seminars for staff in Acceptance, tolerance, and Special Education Recommending all students with disabilities go to the same school Not responding to reports of discimination in schools Refusing to create or implement an IEP for your child Having multiple reports of discimination across schools in the district
